 - (1) Partner with other groups who may have a shared interest, more experience and wider reach
 - (2) Working with schedules can be hard (ex. Don't schedule when Parliament is in session)

Feeding Futures update from Harmen Kailay and Partner Group Reports

7) a) Feeding Futures presentation – Harmen Kailay

- i) Goals: Feed students if they are hungry.
 - (1) equitable access
 - (2) elimination of the fear of judgement
 - (3) addressing food insecurity
- ii) Service students with school-based lunches, a centralized lunch program and 'grab-and-go' style food (or classroom bins for K-3)
- iii) Currently providing roughly 4800 snacks, 620 catering lunches, 1000 meals from school-based lunches prepared on site, 2300 breakfasts, per day, throughout the District.

b) Senior Administration – Lee Karpenko

- i) Feeding Futures: Noted that the program had changed from targeting individuals to get meals to now making food available for all who want it

c) School Board Trustee(s) – Sarah Holland

- i) Feeding Futures: Asked if there was any movement on giving elementary school kids more time to eat, Harman said some elementary schools are extending lunch into instructional time
- ii) Trustee Elections are coming up next October, time to start thinking about putting your name forward!
 - (1) Questions about the Trustee role, contact her (or any Trustee)
- iii) Policy Advisory Committee will be coming up.

d) Prince George Principal and Vice Principals Association – Dylan Clifford

- i) Feeding Futures: Noted that better access to equipment is very helpful and makes things easier

e) Prince George District Teachers Association – Katherine Trepanier

- i) Feeding Futures: Supports extending eating time with supervision and said that having food available for all kids is great for learning.

f) CUPE 3742 – Paula Bass

- i) Feeding Futures: Appreciates this as a parent too. Noted that implementing the program is staying with CUPE workers, which is also appreciated.



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- ii) Report: asked if PACs had any feedback on the new automated system for absences (Elementary). Encouraged parents to reach out to Admin with any comments or concerns.

 - i) Feeding Futures: Culinary Arts program at Duchess makes a lot of meals for the program. Also, it's nice to have the food in a separate, private area so kids don't feel intimidated.
